# 1. Target Audience

#### » Sage 200

- Primarily aimed at SMBs and medium sized organisations often with growth potential or more complex needs. It is also used in larger companies who have outgrown their existing software.
- Sage 200 is suitable for companies in virtually all business sectors, including professional services, retail, construction, manufacturing, distribution, non-profits, healthcare and technology.
- Sage 200 is a popular choice for users of other Sage solutions like Sage 50 who have outgrown their existing finance and accounting software.

- Targeted at a similar market as Sage 200, with a focus on those that require detailed financial reporting.
- It is popular in industries such as education, services, recruitment, hospitality, and public sector organisations.

- Available in two different versions, Sage 200 Standard only works in the Cloud and Sage 200 Professional can be deployed as either on-premise or hosted in the Cloud.

- Primarily a cloud-based solution.
- Access provides full SaaS integration, making it suitable for businesses looking for a fully remote solution.



# 5. Scalability

#### » Sage 200

- Highly scalable, making it a good choice for growing businesses. Sage 200 can support increasing transaction volumes, users, and geographical expansion.
- It's easy to scale with additional modules or add-ons.
