Sage 50 offers basic accounting features whilst Sage 200 is an advanced solution for businesses who want to manage more complex accounting processes.

1. Target Market and Core Users

» Sage 50:

 Aimed at small businesses or start-ups.

» Sage 200:

- Designed for growing SMB's and medium sized enterprises who require either a cloudbased or on-premise finance and accounting solution
- Best suited for growing businesses with complex accounting needs and those that require multi-location, multi-warehouse, and multi-currency.

- Ideal for businesses that need basic accounting features.
- Ideal for companies with more sophisticated financial and reporting needs.
- Sage 200 can be applied and tailored to your specific business industry sector.
- Ideal for companies that have outgrown basic accounting software solutions like Sage 50 and require a more flexible, scalable and customisable finance solution.

2. Deployment Model

» Sage 50:

 Primarily a desktop application, although it has some cloud features (e.g., remote access) and is cloud-connected.

» Sage 200:

- Available both as an on-premise solution and a cloud-based offering.
- The cloud version provides additional benefits like remote access and automatic updates.
- Available in two different versions, Sage 200 Standard only works in the Cloud and Sage 200 Professional can be deployed as either on-premise or hosted in the Cloud.



3. Features Overview

» Sage 50:

- Core Features: Accounts payable/receivable, general ledger, payroll, invoicing, inventory management, and reporting.
- Customisation: Limited customisation options compared to more advanced systems like Sage 200.
- Usability: Easy to use and suitability for businesses with simpler accounting needs.
- Integrations: Integrates with Payroll and third-party applications.

» Sage 200:

- Advanced Core Financial Management: Includes modules for general ledger, accounts payable/receivable, and bank reconciliation, three tier nominal ledger
- Additional modules available such as project accounting, bill of materials, business intelligence, manufacturing and supply chain management.
- Comprehensive Project Accounting: Useful for project-based businesses.
- Inventory Management: Strong capabilities for managing stock, supply chain, and warehouses.

- Advanced Reporting: Includes custom reports and dashboards.
- Multi-currency: Supports businesses operating internationally.
- Multi-entity, multi-location and easy to manage and consolidate multiple companies.
- Integration: Works with various add-ons for areas like CRM, payroll, and more.

- Cloud and On-premises: Sage 200 provides both cloudbased and on-premise deployment options.

» Sage 200:

- Less powerful when it comes to generating complex, real-time, or customisable financial reports.
- Highly flexible and detailed customised reports and dashboards can be created.
- Intuitive and visual dashboards and analytics.

- Scalability is somewhat limited, especially in terms of handling multiple locations, currencies, or complex accounting requirements and reporting.
- It's easy to scale with additional modules or add-ons.
- Sage 200 is a good choice for businesses with multiple locations, multiple companies and for group accounting consolidation.

- Pricing is based on the number of users, with modular pricing for different features and capabilities.
